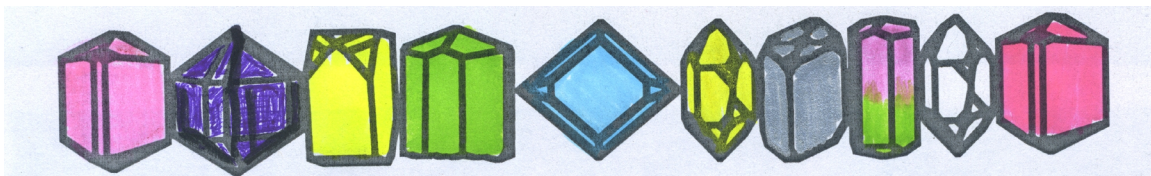


August 2026 Shin-Skinner

Meet at noon, hamburgers and hotdogs and dish to pass at 1 PM.

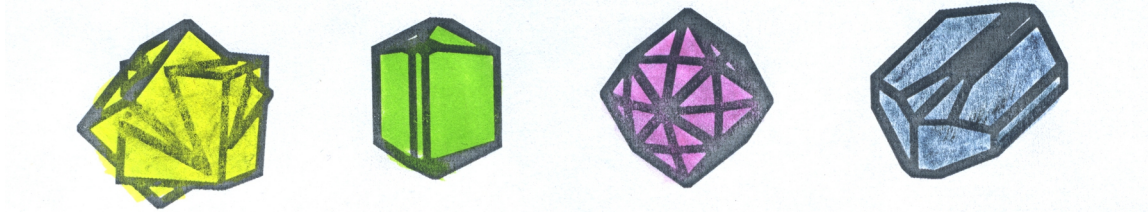
I will have silent bid sheets with the minerals from Beverly Sheffield that are left.
