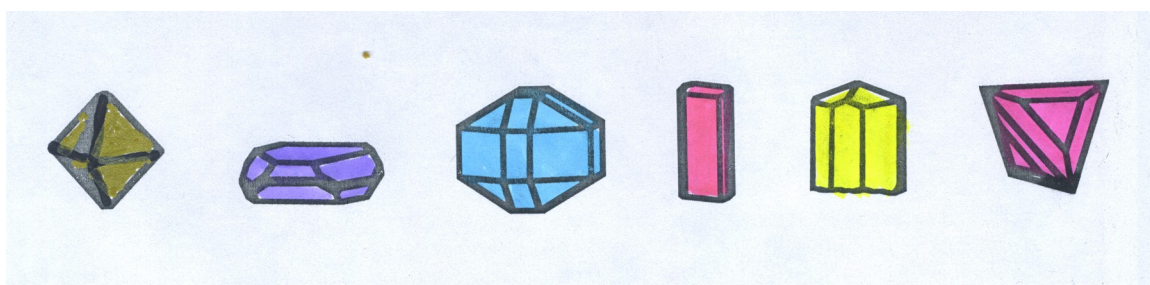


FEBRUARY NEWS LETTER 2025

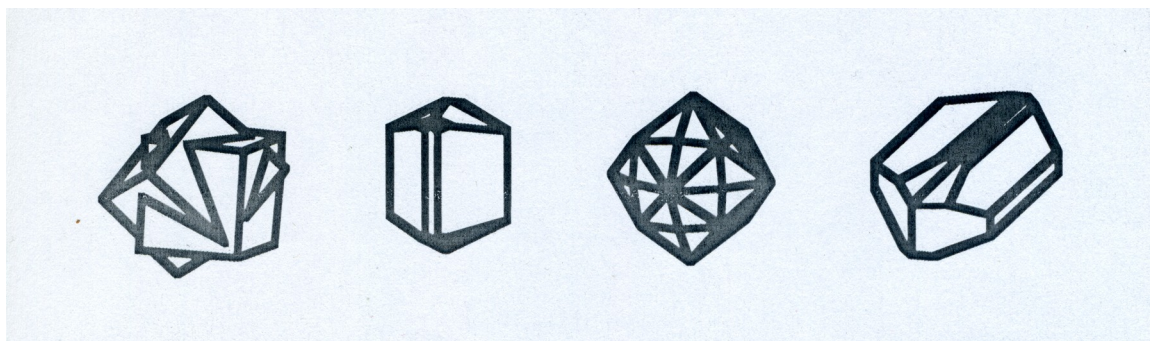
Posters will be available at the February meeting. Pick'em up and get'em out. We can clean up some other details at this meeting.
