



VP NEWS

Recipe – Lemon/Lime Jello Salad

- 1 box instant lime Jello
- 1 box instant lemon Jello
- 2 cups boiling water
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 1 can crushed pineapple
- 1 cup diced walnuts

Directions: Boil two cups of water. While waiting for water to boil, open both packages of jello and spread out across cake pan. Add hot water to Jello and whisk well until all is dissolved. While water is still hot, add sweetened condensed milk and whisk well. Then add remaining ingredients and whisk well. Refrigerate overnight.
