In Memoriam - Joy Bourne

Alice Joy Clark, "Joy" to family and friends, was born November 4, 1932 in Aberdeen, SD. to rural school teachers. After living in Wisconsin and Pittsburgh, her family moved to Liverpool,



NY, where she would meet her future husband "Clyf". After marrying, they moved to Lysander, NY, then Trinidad, then back.

Joy directed the Lysander United Methodist church choir, and was a substitute high school teacher. She then returned to college, where she earned a Bachelor's and Masters in Mathematics at SUNY Oswego. As a result, she taught high school math and computer science.

The time in college kindled an interest in geology and fossils. This led to family vacations for fossil and mineral field collecting.

After Clyf retired, the family moved to Towanda to run Crystal Springs Motel, previously owned by Joy's parents. Joy taught middle and high school math in Towanda, then extension classes at Mansfield University and Penn State.

As rockhounds, Aside from being active in Che-Hanna, both Joy and Clyf were active in the Eastern Federation (EFMLS), attending conventions and holding various posts; Joy was president in 2001. An interest in lapidary followed, for both.


