This month's program will be "The Age of the Earth", a powerpoint presentation by Bruce Oldfield.



Scientists have determined that the Earth is 4.5 billion years old. How do they know that? How has our view of the age of the Earth changed over time? What evidence and techniques do scientists use to determine the age of rocks?

With degrees from SUNY Cortland and Binghampton University (in geology and paleontology), Professor Oldfield has been teaching at Broome Community College (SUNY Broome) since 1975. He is a SUNY Distinguished Teaching Professor and received the Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Teaching.
